Ash Wednesday Prayer Service

Leader: Let us begin in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit, Amen.

Welcome to our school family gathered here today. Ash Wednesday marks the beginning of a special time called Lent. On this day, we put ashes on our foreheads to show our commitment of faith and humility.

Reader 1: Lent is a time for prayer, fasting and almsgiving.

- Prayer helps us to get closer to God and remember the promises made at our baptism.
- Fasting is where we give something up to show our love for God and to be more aware of those living in poverty.
- Almsgiving means to give to others to show we care about justice and are thankful for what God has given us.

Reader 2: Lent gets us ready for Easter, the most important time in the Church. Through prayer, fasting and almsgiving, we remember Jesus's death and resurrection.

Reader 3: May the ashes we receive today remind us that all people are equal in your eyes. This Lent, help us to unite against poverty, to work for justice and to care for all creation.

Reader 4: In this Year of Jubilee, may we be pilgrims of hope. We ask this in Jesus's name.

All: Amen

"During this Lent then, brothers and sisters, let us all ask the Lord, 'Make our hearts like yours." (Pope Francis)

Gospel Reading (Matthew 6:1-4)

Leader: A reading from the Holy Gospel according to Matthew.

Leader: Jesus said to his disciples:

Reader 1: When you do good deeds, don't try to show off. If you do, you won't get a reward from God in heaven.

Reader 2: When you give to the poor, don't blow a loud horn. That's what show-offs do in the meeting places and on the street corners, because they are always looking for praise.

Reader 3: I promise you that they already have their reward.

Reader 4: When you give to the poor, don't let anyone know about it. Then your gift will be a secret. God knows what is done in secret and God will reward you.


Leader: The Gospel of the Lord

Reader 7: We pray for our sisters and brothers who experience poverty and injustice wherever they are in the world. May we unite to end injustices for everyone, everywhere. Lord, hear us.

All: Lord graciously hear us.

Leader: Let us now pray together in the words that Jesus taught us. Our Father...

Closing Prayer

Leader: God of all life, Bless our efforts this Lent to walk humbly with you as we put our faith into action. Guide us on our journey with our brothers and sisters around the world as pilgrims of hope. We pray this in the name of Christ our Lord.

All: Amen.

Leader: Let us conclude, in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.

Lord, hear us.


Create: This week, design a poster or collage, paint a mural or build a model based on the Gospel for the First Sunday of Lent.

Create: This week, act out a short drama based on the Gospel for the Third Sunday of Lent.




Gospel Story: Luke 15: 1-3, 11-32

- Write a prayer thanking God for your mum or the person who looks after you at home. Ask God to look after mothers all over the world and to keep them safe.




Fifth Sunday of Lent
